

Timing

To assist in time keeping of a song beat tempo, it is important to indicate on your Chord sheet the correct tempo you require for the song.

You can use the chart below.

TEMPO MARKINGS Slow

<i>grave:</i>	<i>slow and solemn</i>	~ 40
<i>largo:</i>	<i>very slow</i>	40 ~ 60
<i>lento:</i>	<i>very slow</i>	60 ~ 66
<i>adagio:</i>	<i>slow and stately</i>	66 ~ 76

Moderately

<i>andante:</i>	<i>at a walking pace</i>	76 ~ 108
<i>moderato:</i>	<i>moderately</i>	108 ~ 120
<i>allegretto:</i>	<i>moderately fast</i>	120 ~ 132

Fast

<i>allegro:</i>	<i>fast and bright</i>	120 ~ 168
<i>vivace:</i>	<i>lively and fast</i>	~ 140
<i>presto:</i>	<i>very fast</i>	168 ~ 200
<i>prestissimo:</i>	<i>extremely fast</i>	~ 208

Metronome:

If you do not have a Metronome, then copy and paste the Link below for an online Metronome. www.simple.bestmetronome.com

Click the Icon picture named SIMPLE.

The metronome is fully adjustable, so you will be able to accurately time your Chord Sheets to the speed you sing the song.

Then enter the timing speed at the top of your Chord Sheet
e.g. **J= 100 Andante** (which means 100 beats per minute).
